Dress Code for Liturgical Ministers at the Altar

Your attire should demonstrate your appreciation of how your role fits within the worship experience. Dress should express *respect* and *reverence* for the sacred mysteries that are being celebrated.

Women

- Professional/modest attire
- Dress pants, no jeans or shorts
- No halter or tube tops
- No sleeveless, low-cut or spaghetti straps *—it is suggested* that a sweater or jacket is worn over sleeveless blouses while ministering the Eucharist

Men

- Collared shirt, jacket or sweater, tie is preferred
- Dress pants, no jeans or shorts
- Closed shoes and socks, no athletic shoes or sandals

ALL

- Please no athletic shoes, flip flops, etc.
- No jeans, shorts or sweat pants
- No sweatshirts, t-shirts or tank-tops

Notes:

The 5:30 youth mass and weekday Masses tend to be more casual and men do not have to wear a tie or jacket.

Attire appropriate to the season and the occasion is preferred for special feasts and solemnities such as Christmas and Easter.
